July 6—*Bruce Hecht*—**Corvallis Cohousing Tour**

CoHo Ecovillage, 1975 SE Crystal Lake Drive, Corvallis

The concept of cohousing started in Denmark in 1964, and has spread world wide in the ensuing years. Some call the movement a return to the best of small-town communities, a place where you know your neighbors. Cohousing residents participate in the planning, design, ongoing management and maintenance of their community. Such communities are a blend between private and community space. Bruce Hecht of the CoHo Ecovillage will give us a tour and history of local cohousing here in Corvallis.

July 13—*Dawn Reynolds*—**Tour and History of the Majestic Theater**

Majestic Theater, 115 SW 2nd Street, Corvallis

The Majestic Theater opened in 1913 and operated as a grand movie house, vaudeville stage, and concert hall. When it closed in 1982, there was a successful community effort to save it culminating in city ownership, with management by the non-profit Majestic Theater Management, Inc. It became the home for community theater and other local events. Dawn Reynolds and her staff will regale us with many more details, tidbits, and stories during this “behind the scenes” tour of the theater.

July 20—*Debbie Cozzetto*—**Stahlbush Island Farm Tour: A Real Farm. A Real Place. A Real Family.**

Debbie Cozzetto, Marketing and Sales, has planned an “insider’s” tour of Stahlbush Island Farms, a local innovative farm and food processor committed to offering quality produce. Staff members will conduct a tour of the plant, provide a cutting sample of July products, and present the company’s history and its future directions. Class size is limited to 30 (15 people will tour while 15 will have a presentation, then switch places.) All the class will join together for a question and answer time at the end. Participants meet at the church at 9:15 to carpool to the farm location: 3122 Stahlbush Island Road (off Peoria Rd).

July 27—*Julie Jackson*—**Pacific Region Compost & Coffin Butte Landfill Tour**

Ever wonder where your trash and organic material goes when it “goes away?” Where is Away? What happens at the Landfill stays at the Landfill? Take this field trip to the Pacific Region Compost and Coffin Butte Landfill to find out what happens to the material you put in the cart. Find out what is on the horizon for material recovery. Meet at the church parking lot at 9:30 and we’ll carpool from there to find out!

August 3—*Kim Carson*—**Salmon Watch Tour**

Kim Carson, coordinator of the award winning “Salmon Watch,” will introduce participants to four stream studies focusing on native anadromous fish. Karen Hans, ODFW fish biologist, and other field specialists will present four stations that illustrate the importance of native habitat for fish spawning. Participants will have the option to teach for the historic “Salmon Watch” program upon completion. Meet at 9:30 AM and carpool to Clemens Park on the Alsea River, located west of the turn off to Mary’s Peak. Dress for the weather and possible walking along the wet stream bank for sample collection. The class will go from 10:00 to noon so consider bringing a lunch (or stopping on the way back to eat).

August 10—*Marion Rossi & Sheila Daniels*—**OSU Summer Term Play: *As You Like It***

OSU - Withycombe Hall

*As You Like It* is one of Shakespeare’s best-loved festive comedies. Set predominately in the forest of Arden, it recounts the tale of several misguided lovers who eventually find joy and peace in the arms of their truly truest loves. Filled with some of Shakespeare’s best-known characters (the vibrant heroine Rosaline, the clownish Touchstone, the melancholy Jaques), beautiful songs (“Blow, blow thou winter wind...”), and some of Shakespeare’s most famous words (“All the world’s a stage...”) *As You Like It* captures all the best of the Bard. The OSU 2011 Bard-in-the-Quad production will be directed by Sheila Daniels, former OSU theatre student and nationally-recognized stage director and teacher. This class will meet at Withycombe Theater on the OSU campus.
